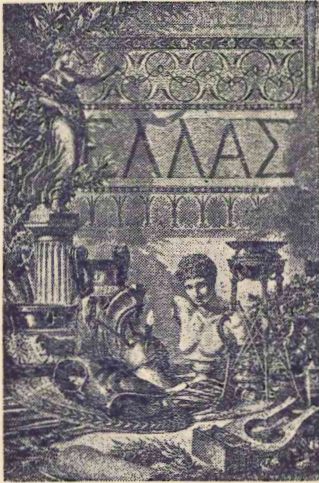

Dear Stanley:

Thank you very much for your letter. I was happy to hear from you.

Mr. Meriano and I talked the matter over about your coming to the United States. This afternoon I saw Mr. Pappas, President of the Greek Church in Boston, about the same thing. Mr. Pappas thinks it is a little too late to collect any money for paying the expenses to this country; in other words--and I agree with him--it will be very difficult to get enough Greek people together who can contribute some money either for you alone or for the two of you. So that it is best not to rely upon receiving anything at the present time--although Mr. Pappas said that "We would pay his trip back." I think you can appreciate if you are not successful as a visitor, that it will be very difficult to get any support, and if the American newspapers find that you are stranded in the United States without enough money to return to Greece it will create a scandal.

Therefore, it is best not to hope for attention.

As far as I am concerned, you can rest assured that I will take care of your expenses in Boston, as I did last year, and I will be both pleased and happy to have you come back and make another trial, for I feel that victory is within your reach, and I am confident that you can be triumphant.

Regards from all members of the family, and hoping that you can collect some money there for the two of you (incidentally, I will be glad to take care of both of you with all expenses paid, while in Boston), I am
