

PCC, an international cooperative effort aimed at expanding global access to library collections










PCC HISTORY

- **CONSER merged with PCC** in 1997




NACO program contributions

- 100 records per year--small libraries (special libraries/state libraries)
- 200 records per year--- large libraries (research libraries/academic libraries)
- Ability to exchange records via FTP (usually through membership in OCLC or RLG)








Database growth FY1992-FY2004


- ☐ Independent NACO participation




INTCO NARs FY04
