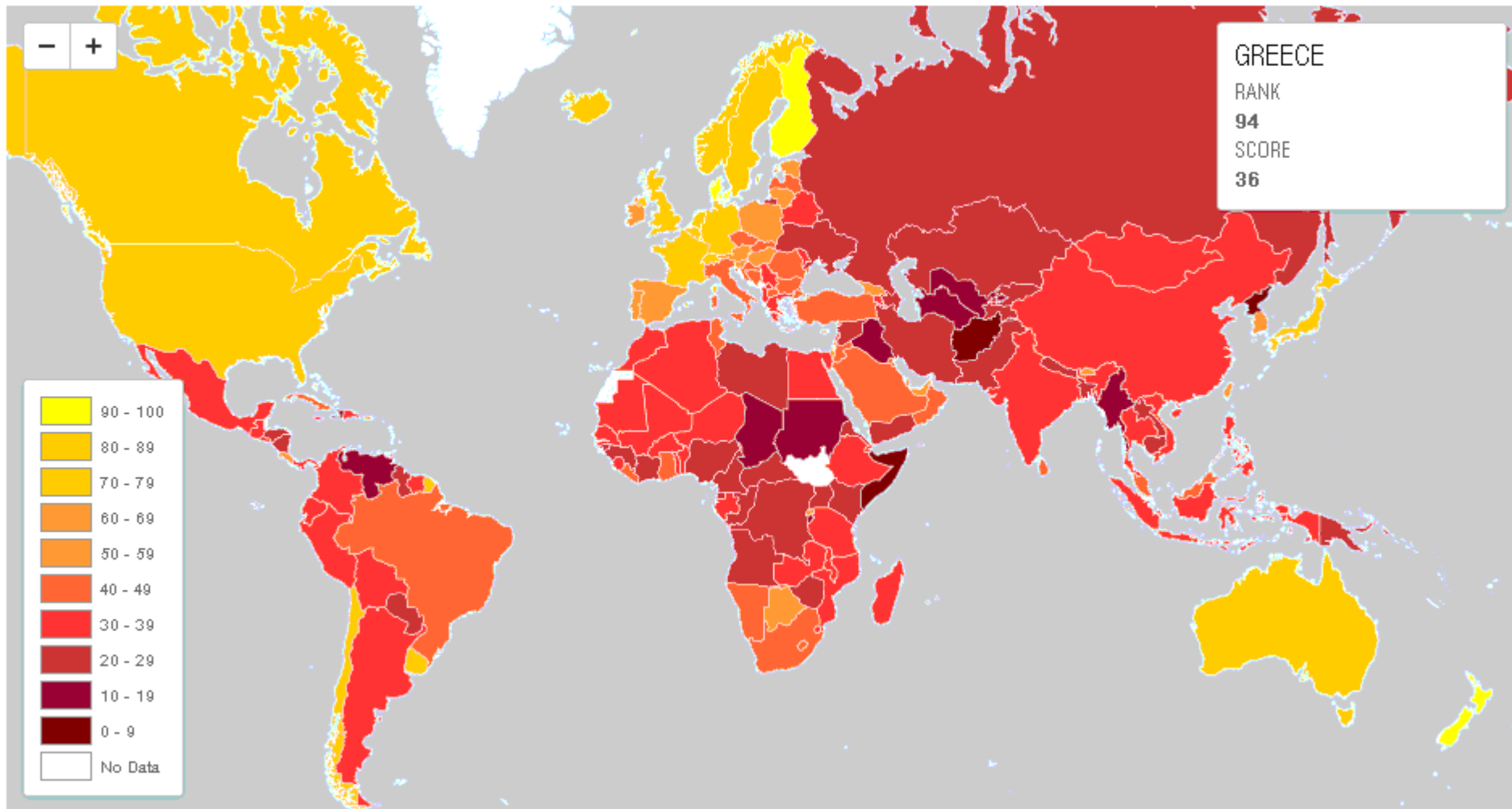

CORRUPTION PERCEPTIONS INDEX 2012

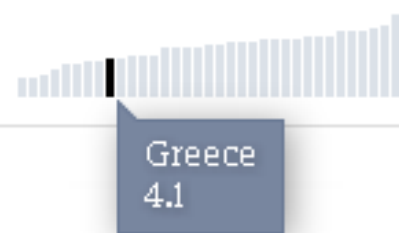

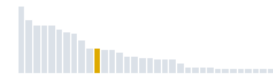

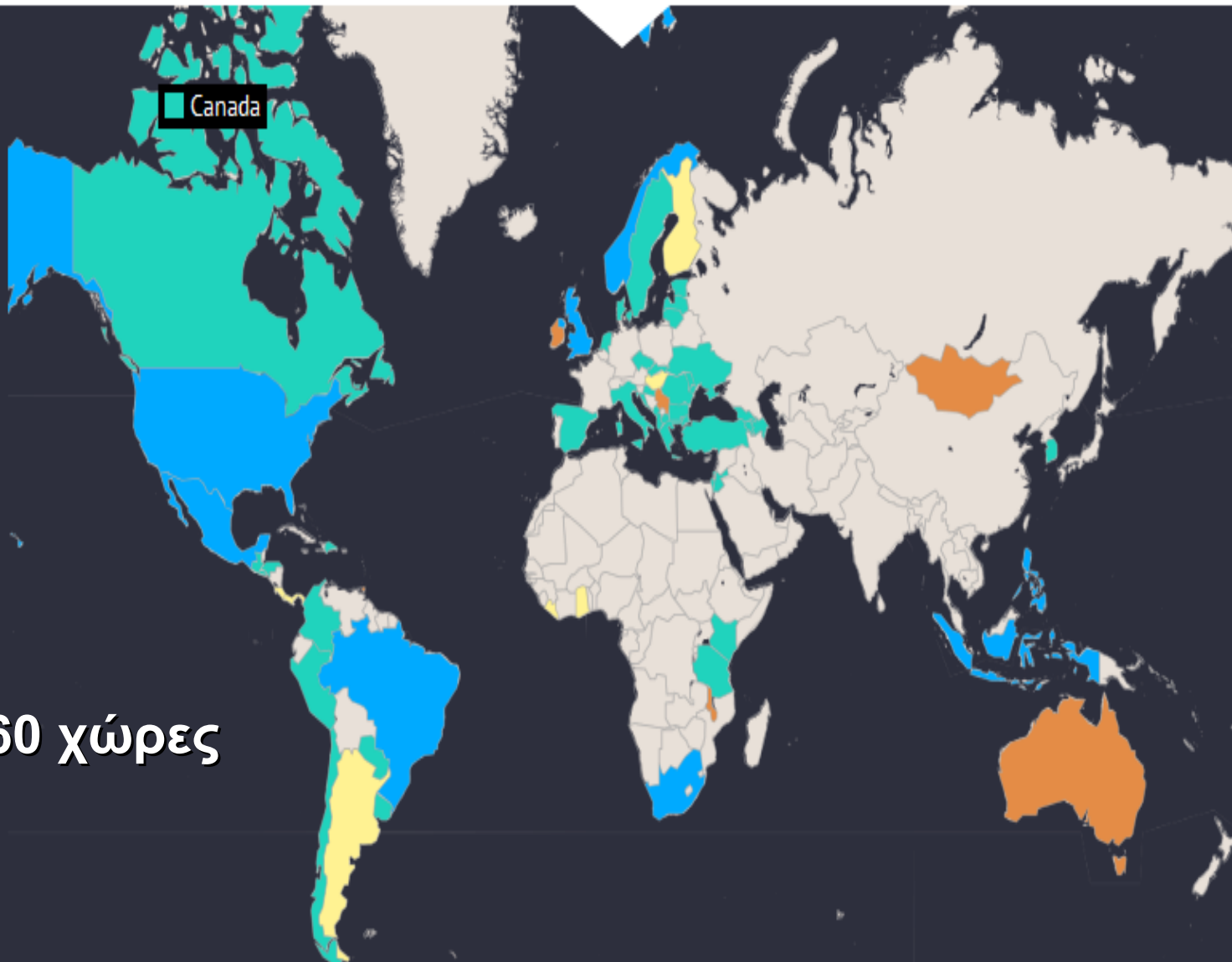

## Open Government Declaration September 2011

As members of the Open Government Partnership, committed to the principles enshrined in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, the UN Convention against Corruption, and other applicable international instruments related to human rights and good governance:

**We acknowledge** that people all around the world are demanding more openness in government. They are calling for greater civic participation in public affairs, and seeking ways to make their governments more transparent, responsive, accountable, and effective.

**We recognize** that countries are at different stages in their efforts to promote openness in government, and that each of us pursues an approach consistent with our national priorities and circumstances and the aspirations of our citizens.

**We accept responsibility** for seizing this moment to strengthen our commitments to promote transparency, fight corruption, empower citizens, and harness the power of new technologies to make government more effective and accountable.

**We uphold the value** of openness in our engagement with citizens to improve services, manage public resources, promote innovation, and create safer communities. We embrace principles of transparency and open government with a view toward achieving greater prosperity, well-being, and human dignity in our own countries and in an increasingly interconnected world.

## Introduction

The Greek government has recognized the critical factor of transparency, accountability and citizen engagement to enable the transition to a new public administration model that is looking for new ways to continuously improve the services provided to citizens and enhance e-democracy and e-participation. The government has introduced a set of open government initiatives aiming to introduce significant levels of transparency, accountability and citizen engagement within all levels of the Greek public administration and to establish a new "social contract" between the citizen and the state. In an ever-changing environment, public administration should monitor new circumstances, be flexible and adaptable to the changes and demands of society. Public administration should respond to the needs of citizens and fulfill their expectations. These are the main initiatives that drive the Greek open government strategy and action plan.

Greece's participation to OGP provides the unique opportunity to the Government to engage in dynamic and productive dialog. The first action plan was drafted in April of 2012. This process led to highlighting Greece's important innovative actions towards open governance such as the Government Portal ERMIS, the open e-deliberation and recruitment platform, the Transparency Program ([Di@vgala.gr](#)), the open taxation data initiative as well as identifying the required next steps.

Furthermore, the Greek government made a series of commitments to further promote open governance as a part of OGP. Those commitments, as described in the action plan, include Boosting Public Engagement, Enhancing Public Resources Management, Opening (Up) Data and Enhancing Transparency.

## Introduction

"We want to be the most open and transparent government in the world."  
- Prime Minister David Cameron (2010)

Back in the spring of 2011, the UK government was one of the founding members of the OGP, sharing the excitement of being in at the start of a new global movement and discussing how best to shape it. Around the world, there were clear signs of a growing appetite for openness in government that had to be satisfied: we had to take action and be part of the movement or be left behind.

Our first National Action Plan was drafted in the very early days, when the OGP was still clarifying the scope of civil society engagement, implementation periods, reviewing mechanisms and so on.

Since the publication of our first National Action Plan, we have forged ahead with both our domestic and international transparency agenda. In a relatively short space of time the UK has positioned itself as one of the world leaders in open data and transparency. Our web portal [data.gov.uk](http://data.gov.uk) is already the most comprehensive data resource in the world, with over 10,000 datasets.

With our second National Action Plan, being drafted in collaboration with civil society, we are looking to
