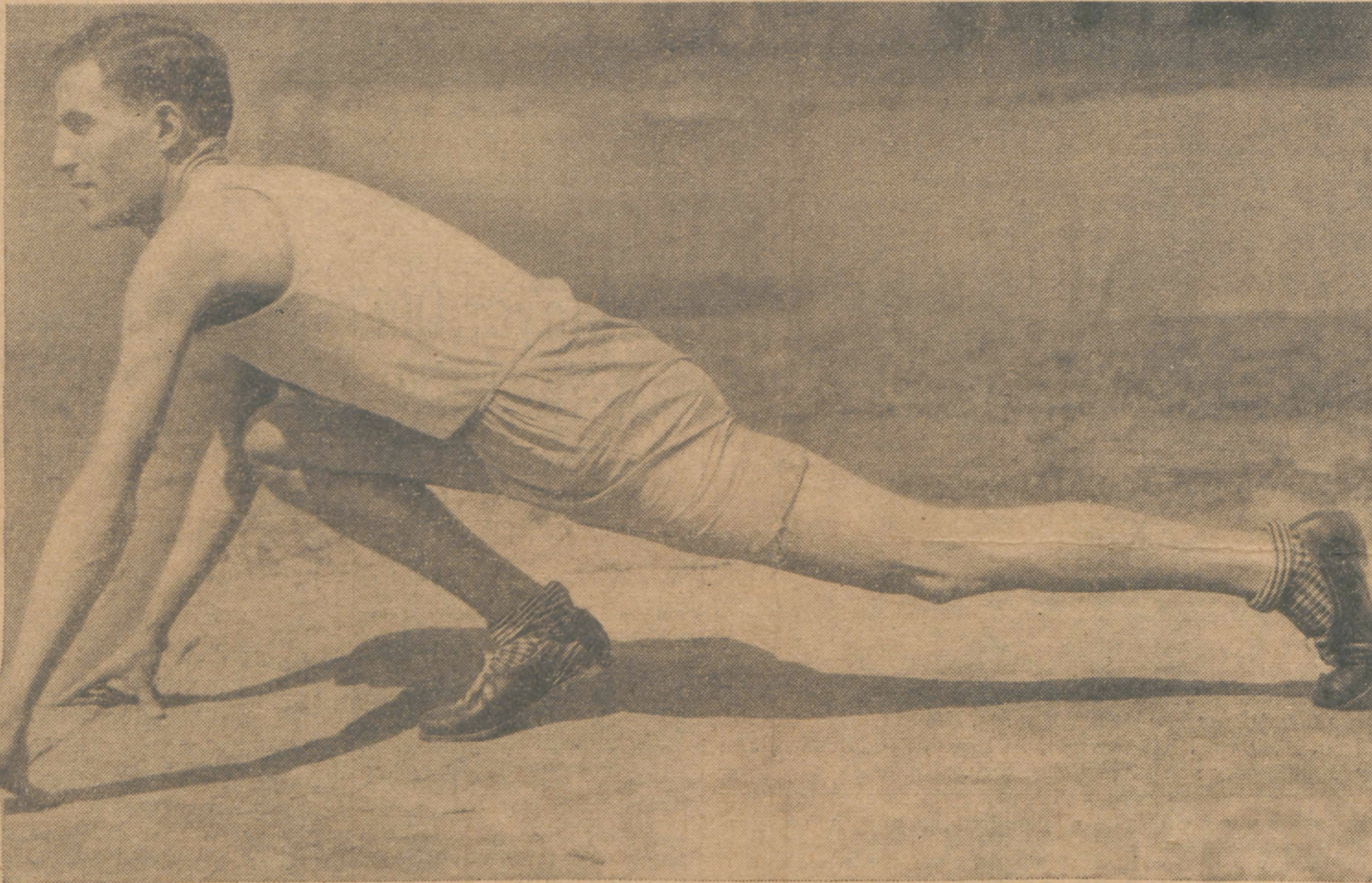


Galloping Greek Out to Win

For when Stanley, as he is known to his American acquaintances, set sail from Athens, included in his baggage was a laurel wreath from the hills of Acropolis as well as the official medal of victory, inscribed in Greek, from the mayor.

Both of these prizes, tokens to be long cherished, will be presented to the winner of the long grind, who might just as well be the serious, hard working plodder from the land in which the long-distance run originated.

Stanley is no stranger to this distance or the route either. In 1934, he captured his first major title, winning the Balkan States marathon. He repeated in 1935 and again last year to establish himself as the outstanding Grecian distance runner.

Adding to his titles, Stanley proceeded to capture the Athens marathon over the original course which Pheidippides made so famous.

Since coming to this country 10 days ago, he has worked out daily, learning the ups and downs of the Hopkinton to Boston route which he now knows by heart.

months before invading this country. Stanley is in fine condition. He tips the scales at 135 pounds, his best competitive weight, and will offer no excuses should he fail to capture top honors.

He feels that Johnny Kelley of Arlington and Leslie Pawson of Pawtucket are the boys to beat, while his host, George Demeter, is consistently warning him to beware of the fancy strides of the St. Hyacinth, Quebec, plodder, Gerald Cote.

Win or lose, Stanley will return to his native land for four months compulsory service in the army. When he has served his time, he intends to get back in stride at his duties in the Greek electric light company before he marries late this year.
