

LOVELOCK'S SURPRISING FAILURE

THE mile at the A.A.A. Championships at the White City, London, provided a surprise in the defeat of Lovelock by Wooderson. The Achilles man Ward led at the start, but Wooderson went ahead at the bell. Lovelock did not go out at the usual spot, and threw his head back eight yards from the tape.
