

YOUNG 181st TO ENTER MARATHON

The entry list for the 51st B. A. A. marathon tomorrow was boosted yesterday to 181 when manager Tom Kanaly agreed to accept a late entry by wire from Walter Young of Verdun, P. Q., who won the race in 1937. Young joins six other former winners: Stylianos Kyriakides, Johnny Kelley, Joe Smith, Clarence DeMar, Gerry Cote and Tarzan Brown.

Among yesterday's arrivals was Eddie Lansdale of Moncton, a Scot who was alternate for Sidney Wooderson on the British 1500-meter squad in 1936. He has been training all winter over the New Brunswick hills and is confident that he will finish well under two and one-half hours.

Since Kyriakides waived his right to wear the No. 1 ordinarily

allotted to the defending champion, the honored figure has been given to Sevki, Koru, the Turk who was the first foreigner to enter. All the other first 10 numbers will be worn by the runners who finished in those positions last year, with the exception of No. 4, which goes to DeMar because Lou Gregory, fourth last year, has not entered.
