Last April's event is grouchingly recalled as "The Marathon Nobody Saw," due to the solid phalanx of vehicles which surrounded the Greek, Kyriakides, and his ardent opponent, John Kelley of West Acton.

The possibility of a reoccurrence has been eliminated. The only vehicles to be permitted upon the course today will be two buses, conveying the race officials and scribes, and a truck upon which has been constructed a special platform for photographers.

The innovation, promoted by Walter A. Brown of the club, will be applauded with gusto by the half-million citizens who will flank the course this afternoon.
