

A prized memory

On a recent trip to Greece, former **Gov. Michael Dukakis** made a personal pilgrimage to the Athens home of the late **Stylianos Kyriakides**, the 1946 winner of the Boston Marathon. Dukakis talked with Kyriakides' daughter, Eleni, telling her he was a young boy in the crowd of spectators a half-century ago who never forgot the sight of Kyriakides catching **Johnny Kelley** to win the race. Kyriakides, who moved to Athens from Cyprus, ran in the 1936 Berlin Olympics and narrowly survived execution in Greece during the Nazi occupation. Boston schoolteacher **Nick Tsiotos** and a Globe editor, **Andy Dabilis**, tell his remarkable life story in the forthcoming book, "Win or Die."
