Eton, High St., past Eton College, along Windsor Rd., then
 L. at "Prince of Wales" 2.m. into Ragstone Rd. Chalvey,
 L. into Church St. after railway bridge,
 R. at "Foresters Arms" and carry on to the fork,
 R. into Tuns Lane, leading to Bath Rd.
 Cross to "Three Tuns" (special crossing plans to be arranged)
 over G.W.R. bridge along Farnham Road, then
 R. at "Jolly Butchers" 4 $\frac{3}{4}$.m. Farnham Royal, along Stoke Road,
 ignoring cross roads. (view of Stoke Poges Church $\frac{1}{4}$.m. on left
 6 $\frac{1}{2}$.m.)
 R. at Fulmer Rd. for $\frac{1}{4}$.m.
 L. into Wexham Rd. at Duffield House, the cross roads at Wexham
 Park 7.m.
 L. into Sherbrook Lane, this turning after the cross roads can
 easily be missed but it leads around Wexham Park for 1 mile
 where it joins the Slough - Uxbridge Road at Furze Lodge 8.m.
 L. at Furze Lodge to the "Crooked Billet" Five Points, Iver Heath,
 9 $\frac{1}{2}$.m.
 R. at "Crooked Billet" into Wood Lane leading to Shredding Green,
 L. at "Red Lion" into Langley Road leading to Iver Village, (Black
 Swan)
 R. at Iver Church, 11 $\frac{1}{2}$.m. into Iver Lane, crossing over G.W.R. and
 Canal.
 L. at the end of Iver Lane (Tower Arms), through Thorney 13.m. until
 West Drayton Green is reached.
 R. at the "Swan" 14.m. to a road called The Green, leading to
 Church Rd.
 R. into the West Drayton - Sipson Rd., leading into Sipson,
 L. at the Baptist Chapel, Sipson Lane, 15 $\frac{1}{2}$.m., continue along Sipson
 Lane, cross Harlington High St. at the "red Lion" into Cranford
 Park Lane,
 L. at the end of Cranford Park Lane, 17 $\frac{1}{2}$.m. into Cranford High St.
 until the "Queens Head" is reached,
 R. into Heston Lane and continue along here for about 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles to a
 small Green at Vicarage Farm Rd., (Heston Lane may also be called
 Cranford Lane)
 L. at the Green for about 100 yards,
 R. for Heston Church, New Heston Rd. 19 $\frac{1}{2}$.m.
 R. at the Church and bear
 L. towards the Great West Rd., until Alderney Avenue is reached, here
 turn

R. (21 $\frac{1}{2}$.m.) along Syon Lane to the Gt. West Rd.,
 L. at Gillette Corner along the Gt. West Rd. until it reaches the
 Chiswick Rd. 24 $\frac{1}{2}$.m.
 R. along Chiswick Rd., L. into Thames Rd. (Strand on Green), Grove
 Pk. Rd., Hartington Rd. Chiswick Stadium, finish with 2 laps
 of track.

NOTES TO COMPETITORS.

1. The "Sporting Life Trophy" value £500, is a perpetual trophy for a race of not less than 25 miles, to be competed for annually on public roads in England by amateurs over 21 and under 50 years of age.
2. The winner of the race must make application to the Editor Sporting Life, Long Acre, W.C. for the possession of the Trophy within three weeks of winning same, and will be allowed, subject to suitable guarantees being given by his Club or some responsible Corporation, to retain the trophy for 9 months.
3. NO competitors will be allowed an attendant, Official Feeding Stations will be on the route and Competitors notified of their position after entry.
4. A competitor must at once retire from the race if ordered to do so by the Medical Officer.
5. Facilities will be provided to pick up competitors who are forced to abandon the race, but responsibility cannot be accepted for men who are considerably outdistanced and refuse transport to the finish.
6. No competitor will be timed in who is more than 1 hour 15 minutes behind the winner at the finish.
7. It is suggested that on entering The Great West Road runners keep on the Cycle track.
8. In order to avoid putting signs upon the roads which may be confusing to motorists or other road users, a Left or Right turn will be denoted by the words "LILAC" and "ROSES" respectively surmounted by the Poly. badge.
