

Athens, 25th October, 1952.

Dear Mr. Kemp,

According to your wish, I invited the three footballers we have in our Company, and I told them about your intention.

My opinion is that this affair of sports is greatly important for the Company, and it will not fail since you are willing to support it.

1. You must put this affair into the hands of a person who knows well everything connected with athletics, and who has the desire to work for this purpose. I feel sure that your idea will be successful and our Company will be more popular, for everybody knows your athletic spirit and good will.

2. The best of the three footballers is Mr. \_\_\_\_\_ we can entrust to him the training and the creation of new footballers, under the guidance of the mentioned responsible person. I ought to tell you that these footballers are but new employees, and I am not sure if they can bring this affair with seriousness to a successful issue.

3. The Company must rent for training one of the well-known playgrounds which will be used for some hours 2 - 3 weekly. There, we must have a room of our own to keep all our things. We must have also some hot showers after the training.

Later on, we can rent for 5 - 10 years a field big enough for basketball, volley-ball, tennis and any other kind of sport. In this field, we must have a dressing room, some showers, and some small refreshments.

While going on excursions we would arrange a football match with the team of the place we happen to go. Such meetings will not cost much to the Company and our players will have the encouraging of their colleagues. On the other hand, we can organize such meetings with football teams of different Companies here, and various clubs as well.

4. I have noticed that a great number of our employees both young ladies and gentlemen want to have some exercise in the morning before starting work. Could we not manage to arrange two places for basket-ball and volley-ball on the roof of our new wing - They did the same thing in the Bank National of Greece - in that way we would prepare some athletes for the coming future.

The person who will undertake the responsibility for all this work must have enough time so that to be able to keep in touch with the various clubs of Athens and the villages, the sport writers and special sport papers.

I need scarcely assure you that I am at your service and would your choice fall upon me I would do my best to deserve your confidence.
