If Paul Revere is whirling over and over in his tomb today it's because all kinds of Patriots' Day tradition went whirling end over end on the Boston-Lexington highways.

Historians may scream, but bere's what happened: filliam Dawes" riding from Roxbury, hitch-hiked on a horse van-with horses, escorts and all-and beat the steaming "Revere" to the Lexington finish line by a good five minutes. It was even more revolutionary than the Revolution it-

Somewhere between Cambridge and Arlington, the "Dawes" impersonator-Lockhart J. Smith, Jr.-got tired of riding and walked his horse into the live stock van that accompanied the jaunt.

HARD ON HIS HEELS

Right on his heels went his four mounted escorts, and the quintet rode at a fast clip for two or three miles holding their steeds by the bridles.

At one point, when the van had to stop suddenly to avoid a running child, the horse held by escort Louis West lurched forward and stepped all over his attendant's foot, eliminating him from any further alarm rides for the day.

"Dawes" went back to his mount before getting to Lexington, and galloped in to an easy win over the traditionbound "Revere."
