

25/5/1962 (Friday);

At 10 am. the Attorney-General came to my office and handed me R. 23 which, he said, had been forwarded to him with by the Chairman of the Commission of Inquiry with the request that it be transmitted by me to the Turkish Ambassador.

At 10.15 am. the Attorney-General asked me to hold R. 23 as he had heard from the Chairman of the Commission that Mr. Justice Tzika did not agree to the text and a further communication would be conveyed to me.

At 10.45 am. the Attorney-General handed me R. 24 and requested me to transmit it to the Turkish Ambassador (instead of R. 23). He said this had been unanimously agreed by the ~~the~~ Commission of Inquiry. This I immediately did - R. 26-25.

At 4.15 pm. I received R. 27 with the enclosures mentioned thereon. Mr. Justice Wilson was at that very moment on the telephone asking me if I had any communication from the Turkish Embassy. I told him ~~what~~ about R. 27 and immediately sent him R. 29.

26/5/1962 (Saturday);

At 9 am. as I was getting out of my car to go into my office the Messenger of the Turkish Embassy was arriving. He handed me an envelope containing R. 32-30 and I signed his book before I went up to my office. I immediately telephoned the Acting President, Mr. Clerides, and informed him of R. 32-30 and then I discussed ~~the~~ R. 32-30 with the Attorney-General. I then drafted a reply (R. 38-33). It was, by then, 1.30 pm. In preparing R. 42-33 ^{R. 42-40} I consulted the Record of the
