

## ACT I.

### FIRST SCENE.

[A stage. Darkness. We cannot see the stage. It may be a mountain-top or the big intestine of a sunk submarine. Shaft of weak light reveals a figure. We make it out to be a man and he talks. We haven't got to listen to him or even see him. In fact we can eliminate him altogether. He is both extraneous and unnecessary. Whatever he says and does have no bearing on what follows. But he is an obstinate character; he insist on making an appearance. We shall meet him again].

MAN. I am called Iliquo. I'm a proletarian troubadour and a bit mad. Mad like the rest - they don't know it. I like to confide in you. I cannot tell you what this is - when it takes place and where. But I cannot tell you because I don't know. Between you and me I don't think that neither he, the puppet master, really knows. He tells me this: You are nothing - he refers to me, me, I'm nothing! I come out, like the vapour of soup and become solid. You see me, he says, and the other solid dreams, like <sup>we are</sup> real. But we are unreal. We are simply automata with a shape and conceived to kick. We ~~remain~~ <sup>are</sup> trembling, even if we kick, by the inexorable laws of drama. You see us, maybe feel and suffer with us. We engage your attention. But you cannot be involved with us unless ~~see~~ <sup>stuck by a sharp light to</sup> realize our own reality. But we are awkward and some of us are full of curiosities.

(1) Footnote: Since the Settlement of Utrecht in 1713 England only twice engaged in wars of her own making and not on the side of some other power only twice. ~~but~~ Those two were colonial wars. The first was the American war of Independence when as a result of a treaty negotiated by Benjamin Franklin and the French in 1778 the French promised to make common cause with the American Colonies till independence was won. Spain and Holland intervened in that war against Britain ~~and~~ seized the first by seizing British ports in Florida and the second by fighting actively against Britain. Catherine the II of Russia formed a League of Armed Neutrality which proved of assistance to the revolutionary. Britain was defeated militarily and diplomatically and the American colonies won their independence.

The second was the South African war at the close of last century. Feeling and interest rallied practically the whole of Europe against Britain. An initial series of military reverse had a sobering effect on British overconfidence but with the exception Germany's attitude during that period was decisive in preventing a continental bloc from being formed against Britain. Britain woke up with a startle to the dangerous possibilities of isolation in which she was placed by her aggressiveness.
