Marathon statue crosses finish line Neighl

Thanks to the persistence of a Chelmsford literary agent, a 12foot bronze statue of two famous Greek marathoners sculpted by Tewksbury's Mico Kaufman is on its way to Marathon, Greece, the gift of a Boston sportswear manufacturer to mark the 2004 Olympics.

Kaufman's bronze is of Spyridon Louis, considered the father of the modern marathon and the winner of the first Olympic marathon in 1896, and Stylianos Kyriakides, who overcame poverty and near starvation to win the 50th Boston Marathon in 1946.

The statue, which cost \$250,000 and was paid for through a gift from the New Balance Athletic Shoe Co., will be unveiled in ceremonies in Marathon on Aug. 9.

Last September, Susan Julian Gates, a former Chelmsford selectwomen whose law practice is primarily devoted to representing artists and authors, approached Jim Davis, the head of New Balance in Brighton about backing the project.

At the time, Gates had help from former governor Michael Dukakis, who intervened with some of the parties involved to keep the project going.

Gates said the sculpture was first suggested by former Boston Globe reporter Andy Dabilis and Nick Tsiotis, the authors of a book about Kyriakides and the impact
