

## A MODERN PHEIDIPPEDES VISITS THESE SHORES







Here are three shots of Stylianos Kyriakide, the 28-year-old Greek marathon champion who has traveled 5000 miles to compete for a laurel wreath which comes from his own Athenian hillsides. Eleventh in the Olympic marathon at Berlin, Kyriakides must be rated among the foremost contenders for the B. A. A. marathon on Patriot's Day. He had his first workout yesterday over the course. On the left, Stylianos (Greek for Stanley) rubbing his shanks, which, you'll observe, are lean and spindly, after the fashion of all good road racers. In the center, the Greek champion in full stride, and it's the kind of a stride you'd expect in a 5000 or 10,000-meter man, both of which Stan is. On the right, a close-up of the Greek invader, smiling the same smile with which he expects to turn the corner of Exeter st. a fortnight hence.
