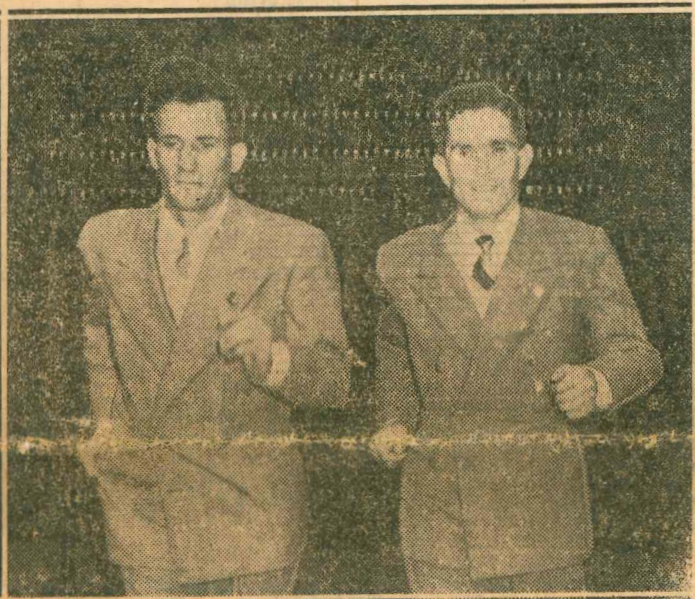


# GREEK CHOICE IN MARATHON
