

GREEK TOP CHOICE IN REDDISH ROAD RUN³¹

Athanasios Rogazos, holder of every record from two miles to ten, in his native Greece, is the favorite in the 39th running of the Reddish A. A. 15-mile road race today, despite the fact it is his first race in America.

Putting such a load as this on the shoulder of a lad in a strange country has everybody lifting their eyebrows, for this field of 99 runners is one of the best.

But it was his fellow countryman and winner of last year's marathon, Stylianos Kyriakides, who started touting the newcomer. He should be an authority, for on many occasions he has chased this fellow in European distance races. He says he will again today for the B. A. A. winner likes the longer routes.

Starting time of this marathon "warm-up" is 2:30 with the gun to be fired in front of the Lowell school on Mozart st., Jamaica Plain, the beginning and end of the new longer course of 15 miles.

More than casual spectators will be Johnny Kelley, winner last year. Ted Vogel, victor last week in Brighton, and the Finnish stars Mikko Heitman and Vaino Muinone, victors over Kyriakides in the Oslo race recently. The Greek threats and mayhap an unknown meteor, will come in for plenty of study.

Opposition however to these well thought of Greeks will come from Charlie Robbins, Jock Semple, Walter Emery, or Paul Donato.

The Reddish club has several plodders wearing its colors, but watch for Lionel Pinn, Micmac Indian, who will be wearing No. 68. He is a war hero patched up with platinum and wires, and has a heart as big as himself, and feels full of run.

Many of the macadam fans will be disappointed because Ted Vogel of Tufts and his foe from B. U., Ted Woods, are not running, as was announced earlier, but they decided to pass this up with their eyes glued to that big prize April 19th.

Coach Bert Hooper, here with the Hawaiian delegation, decided to keep his boys out of this race, feeling it was too risky after such a long haul from Honolulu.

His boys, Norman Tamanaha, Takeo Takuski and Felix Castilano, will be on the sidelines looking over their opponents in the coming classic.

So that it will be easy for the fans to spot the favorites it should be noted that it is Rogazos who is wearing number one and Kyriakides with number two.

The former national champion Robbins will be sporting number three.

The course for the race is:
 Start on Mozart st., at Lowell school, to Centre st., to Holy Name Church Circle, to West Roxbury Parkway, to Veterans of Foreign Wars pkwy., to Spring st., to Centre st., to West Roxbury pkwy., to Washington st., to Cummins hwy., to Hyde Park ave., to Forest Hills sq., to South st., to Centre st., finishing at Lowell School on Mozart st.
