Returning Marathon King Reports:

Greeks 'Went Wild' Over Truman Speech

The people of Greece "went wild" when they heard President Truman's speech, according to Stylianos Kyriakides, 37-year-old winner of last year's B. A. A. Marathon, who arrived in this country last night aboard the TWA liner "Sphinx" to begin training for next month's

"Everybody had their radios on and there were loudspeakers in the streets. It was midnight in Greece but nobody went to bed. The crowds cheered and danced on the streets," Kyriakides said.

"The people of Greece feel confident that Congress will grant them the money. It would help a lot in settling the trouble among the Greeks themselves because the people want work. They want the rebuild the country and have something to eat."
