# GREEK WINS MARATHON

## Kelley in Second Place, Gerard Cote Is Third

### Kyriakides Fulfills Pledge To His Countrymen

BOSTON, April 20—Unhappy Greece had cause for joy and celebration today for the glorious came to pass with the golden jubilee running of the B. A. A. marathon. The winner was Stylianos (Stanley) Kyriakides of Greece, 35-year-old 10-year champion of Greece, Egypt, Turkey and the Balkans, the first and only Greek to win the event that was created by the Greeks back in the ancient time of Pheidippides.

#### WON OBJECTIVE

His time, just 3 minutes off the record, was 2 hours, 29 minutes, 27 seconds.

With his glorious triumph Kyriakides attained his noble objective, that of gaining the national and world prominence that enables him to be a public spearhead in a drive for food, clothing, yes and athletic supplies for his war-stricken home in Greece.

#### KELLY SECOND

Second place went to West Acton's Johnny Kelley, the defending champion and winner of 1945. In finishing with the time of 2:31:27 the 38-year-old Kelley again returned to his seemingly demoted role of B. A. A. "bridge-maid" for this was no less than the seventh time since 1934 that Kelley was second best—the frustrated runner-up.
