Greek Electric Company Bill Collector's Kick Defeats Kelley by Two Minutes in 50th Running of Classic

BOSTON, April 20.—They ranked a chapter out of "Grimm's Fairy Tales" today and rewrote it for the 50th of the Boston A. A. Marathon. The revised script, guaranteed to make Hollywood's scenario men turn various hues of ghastly green, had a Greek who starved all through the German occupation in Athens and flying over here two weeks before the race.

He gets a letter from his three-year-old daughter on the morning of the race urging him to win it. Then, in the vast mortification of assorted experts who had written him off merely as another fellow named Stylianos Kyriakides, five hours of the piece goes out and runs the field of more than 100 starters

Beats Ellis 1 1/2 Lengths in Philadelphia Handicap; Bohanet a Distant 3d

HAVRE DE GRACE, Md., April 20 (AP)—Warren Wright's Armed bounced back from his opening-day defeat at six furlongs and won the \$20,000 added Philadelphia Handicap at a mile and one sixteenth today.
