Dear Mr. Hamilton:

Since Mr Kyriakides last wrote to you about his coming to New York, his schedule has been somewhat modified, and he asked me to acquaint you with changes made, which he hopes very much would not seriously affect the opportunity which you kindly extended him to be with you in his visit to the Westinghouse which he is extremely anxious to see.

I had, as his host in Boston, arranged a little program for him, but Mr Kyriakides, who matches both in restraint and moderation his famous ancestors, stuck strictly to the business at hand- that of training religiously for the Race and carrying off the highest honor. Hence, he has not been paid honors rightly due him as our outstanding marathon champion of Greece. In addition to adhering to his training routine, he desired that no function be publicly given him either this week- Holy week- or next week, which is Greek Holy Week.

Accordingly, it is tentatively planned to fete him a week from Monday, namely April 25, probably in the form of a reception and ball, or banquet. In his letter to you he stated he would see you in your office on that day. It is hoped that you can see him Thursday, April 21, instead. It is planned for him as follows:

Marathon Day, April 19, in Boston; to April 20 incl.  
April 21, Thursday morning, to April 24, in N York.  
April 25, Monday, in Boston, and possibly April 26.  
April 27, midnight, sail for Greece, from N York.

I am very much pleased with his workouts here over the famous B A A course and I am sure he will give a good account of himself that day.

I think Mr Kyriakides will be glad to hear from you, and that you can see him April 21 instead of the 25.
