
UNIC-100 University Experience







Future IL goals

- Make IL training compulsory for all undergraduates students (UNIC-100 or other dedicated course)
- Create or adapt an IL related framework in collaboration with University stakeholders
 - Example: Open University (UK) <u>DIL Framework</u>
 - a common reference point
- Include IL skills in University's mission
- Integrate IL instruction into the curricula of all academic programs
 - IL instruction can be more effective when it is connected with specific needs
 - Requires collaboration with schools, faculties, and individual lecturers
 - Deliver customized IL instruction for specific classes, on the appropriate time
- Create an IL interactive tutorial for students
- Create an IL tutorial for lecturers (how to enhance, promote and assess students skills)
