The *Modern Greek Studies Yearbook* is an interdisciplinary publication whose main objective is the dissemination of scholarly information in the field of modern Greek studies. The field is broadly defined to include the social sciences and the humanities, indeed any body of knowledge that touches on the modern Greek experience. The emphasis will be on the last three centuries although topics dealing with earlier periods, the Byzantine and even the Classical, will be considered provided they relate to aspects of later Greek history and culture. In short, the *Yearbook* should serve as a forum for an ongoing discussion of the "Greeks and their heritages," including the Greeks in the "diaspora." Special attention will be paid to subjects dealing with Greek-Slavic relations or Eastern Orthodox history and culture in general.

The table of contents of the fourth issue is suggestive of the nature and range of topics featured in the *Yearbook*. It is also suggestive of the international scope of the publication and the efforts to promote a dialogue between scholars from different parts of the world.
